

29. (Week of March 7, 2010)

### 2 Timothy 3–4

**Memory Verse:** *All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness (2 Tim. 3:16 NIV).*

- Sun:** 2 Timothy 3:1-5 – Which of these evils do you see prevalent in our society today? Have you been wrongly influenced?
- Mon:** 2 Timothy 3:6-13 – Contrast Paul and Timothy (vv. 10-12) with the evil men described in verses 6-9, 13.
- Tue:** 2 Timothy 3:14-17 – Why should the Bible have a prominent place in your life and in the life of your family?
- Wed:** 2 Timothy 4:1-5 – What is Paul’s charge to Timothy? Why does he give it?
- Thu:** 2 Timothy 4:6-8 – What is Paul’s attitude toward death? Do you share his confidence?
- Fri:** 2 Timothy 4:9-15 – List Paul’s hardships and his needs. How could Timothy be of help to him? Who is someone you could help today?
- Sat:** 2 Timothy 4:16-22 – How does the Lord help us in an hour of trial?

30. (Week of March 14, 2010)

### Titus and Philemon

**Memory Verse:** *For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say “no” to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age (Titus 2:11-12 NIV).*

- Sun:** Titus 1:1-9 – What are the domestic, personal, and doctrinal qualifications for elders?
- Mon:** Titus 1:10-16 – Contrast the evil men described here with the elders described in verses 6-9.
- Tue:** Titus 2:1-10 – Focus on the instructions that apply to you. How do you need to grow?
- Wed:** Titus 2:11-15 – What do you learn here about the past, present, and future dimensions of our salvation?
- Thu:** Titus 3:1-15 – How is a person saved? What results should salvation bring about in a person’s life?
- Fri:** Philemon 1-7 – How is Philemon a good example to us?
- Sat:** Philemon 8-25 – From these verses reconstruct the story of Onesimus. What is Paul’s plea to Philemon, and why does he make it?

31. (Week of March 21, 2010)

### Hebrews 1–2

**Memory Verse:** *How shall we escape if we ignore such a great salvation? (Heb. 2:2 NIV).*

- Sun:** Hebrews 1:1-3 – How is Jesus Christ shown to be greater than the prophets? Try to explain each phrase in verses 2-3.
- Mon:** Hebrews 1:4-9 – From these Old Testament quotations, how is Christ shown to be greater than the angels?
- Tue:** Hebrews 1:10-14 – Repeat yesterday’s question.
- Wed:** Hebrews 2:1-4 – What warning is given to us here and why?
- Thu:** Hebrews 2:5-9 – What is God’s plan for the human race? How does Jesus bring this plan to fulfillment?
- Fri:** Hebrews 2:10-13 – Repeat yesterday’s questions.
- Sat:** Hebrews 2:14-18 – Why did the Son of God become a man?

32. (Week of March 28, 2010)

### Hebrews 3–4

**Memory Verse:** *For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin (Heb. 4:15 NIV).*

- Sun:** Hebrews 3:1-6 – How is Christ shown to be greater than Moses?
- Mon:** Hebrews 3:7-15 – How can we avoid meeting a disastrous fate like Israel in the wilderness?
- Tue:** Hebrews 3:16-18 – Why did most of Israel fail to enter the promised land?
- Wed:** Hebrews 4:1-5 – How can we be sure of entering into the “rest” God has promised to us?
- Thu:** Hebrews 4:6-11 – Repeat Wednesday’s question.
- Fri:** Hebrews 4:12-13 – What truths do you learn here about God’s word and about God Himself?
- Sat:** Hebrews 4:14-16 – What truths are taught here about Jesus, our High Priest? How should we respond to these insights?
